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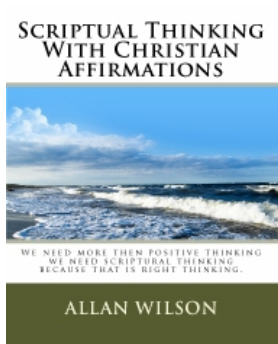

Let's have a look at a scripture to show you what I mean...

In 1 Chronicles Chapter 29 we read of a great time of rejoicing for the children of Israel.

Why?

EVERYONE had just freely given such things as gold, silver, brass, iron, wood, precious stones, and voluntary labor towards the work of the Lord.



King David was extremely happy, not only with the end result, but also more importantly with the attitude of his people who were so willing to do such a thing and so King David began praising God.

Here are some of the things he said...

❖ **For all that is in the heaven and in the earth belongs to God**

Yours, O LORD, *is* the greatness, The power and the glory, The victory and the majesty; For all *that is in heaven and in earth is Yours*; Yours *is* the kingdom, O LORD, And You are exalted as head over all.

❖ **Both riches and honor come of God**

Both riches and honor *come from You*, And You reign over all. In Your hand *is* power and might; In Your hand *it is* to make great And to give strength to all.

❖ **All things come of God, and when we give to God we are just giving back a little of his own**

But who *am* I, and who *are* my people, That we should be able to offer so willingly as this? For all things *come from You*, And of Your own we have given You.

❖ **Everything comes from God and belongs to him**

O LORD our God, as for all this abundance that we have provided for building you a temple for your Holy Name, it comes from your hand, and all of it belongs to you.

❖ **Willingly offer these things to God is the right thing to**

"I know also, my God, that You test the heart and have pleasure in uprightness. As for me, in the uprightness of my heart I have willingly offered all these *things*; and now with joy I have seen Your people, who are present here to offer willingly to You.

Please Concentrate On What Is Being Said Here!

The people had really just excelled themselves in giving. They had given enormous amounts of money to the work.

However... What they really did was give back to God, just a little of what he had already given them.

Do you see that?

Money is not evil... The **LOVE** of money is evil. You can not serve God and Mammon (Money).

There is a lot of good you can do with money if you don't treat it as your own. As soon as you come to the realization that whatever possessions you have are a gift from God and they are not your own the better off you will be.

Everything you have belongs to God. You are simply the manager of his money. In other words you are God's stewards.

This begs a different question...

If you were left in charge of a large amount of your friends money how careful would you be with it?

Of course you would be very careful...

When placed in charge of someone else's possessions you do everything in your power to protect it or if asked to do so spend it wisely on his or her behalf.

Yet sadly today because we have this concept of money being evil the majority of Christians have adopted a cavalier attitude to spending and as a result find themselves in debt and the Lord's work and the care of the poor gets very little funding as a result.

We should be aware that we are wasting God's money and not our own!

Stewardship is being responsible for the management of someone else's property: It is being a manager of assets that do not belong to us, but with which we have been entrusted.

Think in terms of management, not ownership.

It really comes down to who or what you LOVE. Hopefully you love God not money. You see we are told in...

Matthew 6:33 But **seek ye first the kingdom of God**, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.



A good lesson about stewardship can be gleaned from the following passage of scripture...

Luke 16:1-13



And he said also unto his disciples, There was a certain rich man, which **had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods.**

And he called him, and said unto him, How is it that I hear this of thee? **give an account of thy stewardship;** for thou mayest be no longer steward.

Then the steward said within himself, What shall I do? for my lord taketh away from me the stewardship: I cannot dig; to beg I am ashamed. I am resolved what to do, that, when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.

So he called every one of his lord's debtors unto him, and said unto the first, How much owest thou unto my lord? And he said, An hundred measures of oil. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty.

Then said he to another, And how much owest thou? And he said, An hundred measures of wheat. And he said unto him, Take thy bill, and write fourscore.

And the lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light.

And I say unto you, Make to yourselves friends of the mammon of unrighteousness; that, when ye fail, they may receive you into everlasting habitations.

He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much.

If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches?

And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who shall give you that which is your own?

No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. **Ye cannot serve God and mammon.**

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Let's Have A Closer Look At This...

The rich man is God.

The steward is you.

How do you think you're doing with God's money?

Are you worried God will accuse you of wasting his money?

What will you say if he asks you to give account of your stewardship?

I know this ebook is aimed at operating a successful online business by applying Biblical principles and we'll get to that soon however it is also important to prepare the way... so to speak – by preparing our hearts with the aspects covered so far.

As clearly pointed out in the above scripture if we are careless and thoughtless with that which is least (money) then we'll also be unjust in the more important things God wants us to do.

If we can not be trusted with unrighteous stuff such as money then how can we be relied upon for the true riches God has for us?

And if we were so untrustworthy with that which belongs to someone else how much more careless will we be with that which is our own?

This is extremely important!

How does God want you to gain wealth?

Righteously... That means we don't steal, cheat, deceive or make profit from unrighteous activities.

How does God want us to spend his money?

Wisely... That means we pay tithes, taxes, take care of our family commitments and savings plus provide for the poor. As businessmen we pay our bills on time, charge fair prices, deliver quality products, offer great support and treat our employees fairly.

While much could be said about how we as individuals could be better stewards of God's money let's move on now to strictly online business matters...

The first thing people need of course is something to sell or an opportunity to promote. Many get frustrated with this very first obstacle and sadly many also fall victim to the myriad of get rich schemes on the net.

Let's get one thing very clear in your mind right now!

To be successful online will take just as much work and effort as running any other off line business. The only advantage is that it is much cheaper and almost anyone can now have the opportunity to at least attempt to start an online business while not sacrificing his or her current day job.

Discover the Importance of Hard Work...

You know we human beings are a lazy bunch... We seem to crave for instant gratification.

No matter what it is our society wants the quick fix solution.

And it's because of this very reason that many get ripped off.

From weight loss products to get rich schemes many otherwise perfectly sound-minded men and women get sucked into elaborate sales pitches that promise quick, easy and instant fixes.

Do you really believe an ad that says you can lose as much weight as you want in lightning fast speed by eating all the food you want and doing no exercise?

Of course you don't! Yet many of you reading this have probably had a brain explosion at sometime in your life and fell for just such a sales pitch.

It is the same with all the get rich schemes... Once again do you truly believe that you can earn huge amounts of money by doing absolutely nothing?

Of course you don't! But once again I'm sure many of you have fallen for these silly schemes despite your brain telling you it is impossible.

Hopefully after you have read this book you will avoid any get rich quick scheme and prepare yourself to work hard for success.

Now that might not sound too glamorous or exciting but it works... And I can guarantee you that if you work hard for 5 years and apply Biblical principles with it and...

You have a friend who spends the same 5 years chasing get rich schemes... **that in 5 years time you will be the one who your friend says got rich quick.**

Let's have a peek at some of the Scriptures that clearly demonstrate the Biblical principle of hard work...



From the following scriptures you should plainly see that to be successful and prosper you need to work for it and avoid any get rich schemes...

Proverbs 10:4-5

He becometh poor that dealeth with a slack hand: but the hand of the diligent maketh rich. He that gathereth in summer is a wise son: but he that sleepeth in harvest is a son that causeth shame.

Proverbs 21:17

He that loveth pleasure **shall be a poor man:** he that loveth wine and oil shall not be rich.

Ecclesiastes 5:12

The sleep of a labouring man is sweet, whether he eat little or much: but the abundance of the rich will not suffer him to sleep.

Proverbs 13:11

Wealth gotten by vanity shall be diminished: **but he that gathereth by labour shall increase.**

Proverbs 28:19

He that tilleth his land shall have plenty of bread: but **he that followeth after vain persons shall have poverty enough.**

Discover the Power of Honesty...

Now... Not only is this the right thing it also just makes good business sense.



Lev 19:35-36 Ye shall do no unrighteousness in judgment, in meteyard, in weight, or in measure. **Just balances, just weights**, a just ephah, and a just hin, shall ye have: I am the LORD your God, which brought you out of the land of Egypt.

Now all that old type of language might sound a bit strange but what it is saying is to charge what is right!

Now this has two aspects to it...

Immediately I'm sure you've grasped that you shouldn't rip anyone off with exorbitant charges... I don't know how many times I've seen Television shows where they take a perfectly good car to different mechanics and catch out the crooks that charge a fortune for fictitious problems.

I've also seen the same set up for all sorts of things like plumbers, electricians and so on. Make sure you are honest in your business dealings.

But you should also not cheapen or destroy a product by charging ridiculously low prices as well... I'm sure you've heard horror stories of a huge supermarket opening next door to a smaller shop. The supermarket slashes prices because they are so huge they can absorb the initial loss until the little shop can't compete any more and goes broke.

There's nothing wrong with charging a proper price for a proper service or product.

By applying the correct Biblical principles you will supply a product of quality. You will offer full money back guarantees or replace defective goods with new ones.

It just makes good business sense to look after your customers. If they are happy with your product or service they will buy from you again in the future.

Why not give them something extra? A surprise bonus or a discount voucher for next time or some such thing.

I want to touch on something else here...

1 Timothy 5:18 For the scripture saith, Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treadeth out the corn.
And, **The labourer is worthy of his reward.**



Sometimes businessmen in our Churches can be placed at a huge disadvantage. They get called upon by many for help and in most cases they do it for free or for very little money because they genuinely want to assist another Christian and because it is too awkward for them to ask for money from a brother or sister.

This is where we as **the customer should pay a worthy price.** These businessmen must earn a profit to provide for their families and the work of the Lord... I actually witnessed someone who is a non-Christian actually do this...



He asked a fellow work friend to get him a load of wood. Now this fellow worker went beyond the call of duty and delivered him a huge load of wood.

When how much this fellow asked gave a very generous price of just \$80 which the other fellow new was at least half of what he would have paid for an inferior load of wood.

So this man then paid the fellow \$150 which he would have paid any way. This man did the right thing. He still came out in front because he got a quality product (a huge load of wood) and the other fellow got a fair wage for his work.

Because each fellow treated each other this way the man who delivers wood will certainly continue to over deliver to such a generous man who pays a legitimate wage and the generous man will continue to use this guy because he over delivers.

I have included a Scripture below that shows another story demonstrating this principle. It involves Abraham buying something for its true value despite being offered it for free.

Genesis 23: 7-16

And Abraham stood up, and bowed himself to the people of the land, even to the children of Heth. And he communed with them, saying, If it be your mind that I should bury my dead out of my sight; hear me, and intreat for me to Ephron the son of Zohar,

That he may give me the cave of Machpelah, which he hath, which is in the end of his field; for as much money as it is worth he shall give it me for a possession of a buryingplace amongst you.

And Ephron dwelt among the children of Heth: and Ephron the Hittite answered Abraham in the audience of the children of Heth, even of all that went in at the gate of his city, saying, **Nay, my lord, hear me: the field give I thee, and the cave that is therein, I give it thee;** in the presence of the sons of my people give I it thee: bury thy dead.

And Abraham bowed down himself before the people of the land. And he spake unto Ephron in the audience of the people of the land, saying, **But if thou wilt give it, I pray thee, hear me: I will give thee money for the field; take it of me,** and I will bury my dead there.

And Ephron answered Abraham, saying unto him, My lord, hearken unto me: the land is worth four hundred shekels of silver; what is that betwixt me and thee? bury therefore thy dead.

And Abraham hearkened unto Ephron; **and Abraham weighed to Ephron the silver, which he had named in the audience of the sons of Heth, four hundred shekels of silver, current money with the merchant.**

Let's have a look at some more Scriptures concerning honesty...



Psalm 37:16

A little that a **righteous** man hath is better than the riches of many wicked...

Proverbs 11:4

Riches profit not in the day of wrath: **but righteousness** delivereth from death.

Proverbs 22:1

A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favour rather than silver and gold.

Proverbs 19:1

Better is the poor that walketh in his **uprightness**, than he that is perverse in his ways, though he be rich.

Before moving on let's look at two more aspect of honesty and how it relates to your online business...

The Vital Ingredient Your Sales and Advertising Copy Absolutely Must Have...

What is it?

HONESTY

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Romans 12:17

Recompense to no man evil for evil. **Provide things honest in the sight of all men.**

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Now this doesn't mean that you can't write a very effective advertising campaign or create a sizzling web sales letter.

But it does mean you shouldn't lie...

There are many tactics being used to deceive people into buying now.

I don't know about you but when a salesperson comes to my door and they pressure me too much they have lost me immediately. No Sale!

Of course we know that it is important to have some urgency in our sales copy to get people to buy now because quite often on the web you've really only have one shot at them before they disappear into cyber space.

But do we need to use deceptive practices like scripts that change the date? You know the ones I mean... This offer is only available at this price until midnight (today's date).

If you were the customer and you found out that this was a lie then how much would you then trust anything else that person had to say?

Straight away you have lost credibility.

How Keeping Accurate and Honest Records for the Tax Man Can be a Blessing and Nothing to be Feared...

Matthew 22: 17-21

Tell us therefore, What thinkest thou? Is it lawful to give tribute unto Caesar, or not? But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, Why tempt ye me, ye hypocrites? Shew me the tribute money. And they brought unto him a penny.



And he saith unto them, Whose is this image and superscription?

They say unto him, Caesar's. Then saith he unto them, **Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's.**

Everyone seems to fear the taxman and sadly most try to cheat with his or her taxes as well.

However if you do all things honestly and keep correct records then you have nothing to fear.

Do not cheat. Trust that the Lord will bless your righteous actions.

This isn't to say that you don't seek professional help and claim all that you are legally entitled to. But do not cheat and falsify your records.

One of my old Pastors really drove this lesson home time and time again when I first came to the Lord. Be honest in everything **including** your taxes...

I also remember many years ago when he went to trade his car in for a new one. Now this car he was trading in really was an old bomb. So he goes to the salesman at the car yard and tells him everything that's wrong with it and asks how much could he get for the trade in on another car.



Now this salesman was a pretty slick character and said that he reckoned he could do real well by ringing up some other fellow.

The Pastor said to him to make sure you don't lie about the car and the salesman agreed. Anyway the salesman got on the phone and gave a great false spiel about this car and got what seemed like a good price.

The Pastor said sorry I told you not to lie about the car and I'm going somewhere else. The salesman laughed at him and said he was mad and that he would never get offered a better price anywhere else.

So the Pastor goes down the road to another car lot and tells the guy there the same thing about the car and to cut a long story short he ended up getting \$2000.00 more for the car by being honest about it's condition then by lying about it.

Now this story might not have much to do about your taxes but the same principle applies. In the long run you'll be rewarded more for honesty then you will ever get from cheating.

How The Christian Business Principle of Going The Extra Mile Can Gain You Life Time Customers...

There are many ways you can apply the Scripture of going the extra mile to your business however I'm going to show you a simple example involving excellent customer service...

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Matthew 5:41

And whosoever shall compel thee to go a mile, go with him twain.

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In about March 2001 someone gave me a great lesson in customer service. I had finally decided to go into the resell rights business and purchased a package of ebooks that I could start reselling.

I then eagerly went about setting up my web site happy that I finally had my own products to promote.

After a while I decided to check each ebook in the package and it was then that I found many were written by FreetoSell.com

I was alarmed when I read that you could not resell these books without the written permission of freetosell.

So I contacted FreetoSell.com with my concerns - I received a reply from Tom Hua within 5 minutes. To cut a long story short 3 emails later (all answered politely and promptly by Tom) I received an offer from Tom that almost knocked me over.

Remember I was NOT his customer. He never at any stage made any money from me. Yet he was still very patient and helpful to me.

What was the offer?

Read for yourself...



"I understand that you bought my ebooks from one of my resellers (I have no idea who it might be). I would still like to give you access to my download page just like you bought from me directly.

Your unique access will be set up instantly.

You might feel strange. However I take a different approach to online success. It works for me. I do this also to protect my resellers."

What is the lifetime value of your customer?

What Tom has done here is win me over for life. I now trust him. Every time he releases another product he has a good chance of making a sale. You see, building up trust and keeping lifetime customers should be the number one priority in your business.

Just to demonstrate this further. A few months after this all happened Tom opened a new web site. When Tom sent out the announcement I was one of the first to join. I have also recommended the site, found here: <http://www.ebookresellerkit.com/ebooks.html> to many others who have also joined. Now Tom is earning a residual income from those people.

You see his excellent support service has come back to repay him big time.

So don't ever underestimate the value of anyone who is asking you a question. Always reply to your emails and be as helpful as you can. Not only is it the right thing to do but it makes just plain good business sense.

I hope that this real life story helps you in understanding the importance of going the extra mile. Another little scripture it reminds me of is that **you reap what you sow!**

Galations 6:7

Be not deceived; God is not mocked: **for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.**

So why don't you try GIVING something extra to someone sometime?



Think about it... When someone does something nice for you don't you feel indebted to him or her? Of course you do! You want to repay their kindness... It takes you totally by surprise and it makes you feel good inside.

Of course you should be aware that the opposite is also true. How often have you received a nasty email?

Let's be honest – what was your first reaction?

Not too good was it?

This is where you need to turn the other cheek...

Matthew 5:39

But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.

And not reply with anger, as it will only inflame the situation...

1Peter 3:9

Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for

railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.

Proverb 15:1

A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.

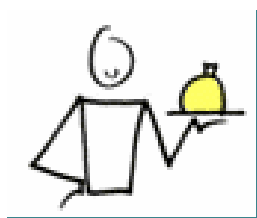


However... you see what happens don't you?

Breaking Through the Barrier Called Fear...

Fear is the greatest enemy most people will ever face. Fear stops most from even starting.

So let's look at some positive stuff from the Scriptures...

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Phillipians 4: 13

I can do all things **through Christ which strengtheneth me.**

Proverbs 14: 26

In the fear of the LORD **is strong confidence:** and his children shall have a place of refuge.

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They say that when we speak positive things to others it helps lift their self-esteem and leads them to bigger and better things.

Well the Bible speaks positive things to YOU.

You CAN do it...

If you are apprehensive or a bit fearful I can relate with you. In fact I think everyone suffers from it at least a little bit however it is how we deal with it that makes the difference.

The only way I know is to tackle it head on. Whatever it is that is worrying you, deal with it and get it over and done with as quickly as possible. The longer you dwell on it the more fearful you will become.

The best example I can think of from the Scriptures is David taking on Goliath. Read that story again and you will see how David took on the challenge head on knowing God was with him.

Seek the Wisdom that Comes from God and You Will Always be Successful...

Proverbs 4: 7

Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding.



Proverbs 3: 13-14

Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding. For the merchandise of it is better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold. She is more precious than rubies: and all the things thou canst desire are not to be compared unto her. **Length of days is in her right hand; and in her left hand riches and honour.**

Proverbs 9: 10

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding.

James 1: 5

If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.



Of course to gain wisdom you also need to study and learn. If you want to know more about a subject it's just not going to enter into your brain by itself – be wise.

Another vital factor in being successful is experience. You know the saying... You can't put an old head on young shoulders.

So it is with **wisdom and experience**. You can only get them by applying yourself and you can only get experience after you have started.

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And God said to Solomon, Because this was in thine heart, and thou hast not asked **riches**, wealth, or honour, nor the life of thine enemies, neither yet hast asked long life; but **hast asked wisdom and knowledge for thyself, that thou mayest judge my people**, over whom I have made thee king: Wisdom and knowledge is granted unto thee; and I will give thee **riches**, and wealth, and honour, such as none of the kings have had that have been before thee, neither shall there any after thee have the like.
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Do you understand the secret yet?

*****The secret to getting money is to stop chasing after it*****

The secret to true happiness and success is to chase after God and the wisdom and understanding that he provides.

Wisdom has length of days in its right hand and riches and honor in its left hand.

Let's have a look at some Scriptures to see that it is possible to be rich and serve God...



Genesis 13:2

And Abram was very **rich** in cattle, in silver, and in gold.

Abraham was the Friend of God. He obeyed God in all he asked. Abraham is so highly esteemed that even in the New Testament era the children of faith are called the children of Abraham.

Yet Abraham was rich. Read how humble and obedient to the word of God this man was and you will learn how you can be rich and still serve God.



1 Chronicles 29:28

And he died in a good old age, full of days, **riches**, and honour: and Solomon his son reigned in his stead.

King David was called a man after God's own heart. He led the almost perfect life apart from a huge blot on his character. He demonstrates the forgiveness of God and yet he too was rich.

However if you study his life you will also see a man of faith who took on Goliath the giant, a man who stood up for the poor, a man who himself endured hardship and lived in caves.

Proverbs 10:22

The blessing of the LORD, it maketh **rich**, and he addeth no sorrow with it.

Proverbs 14:24

The crown of the wise is their **riches**: but the foolishness of fools is folly.

Matthew 27:57

When the even was come, there came a **rich** man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple:

Again we see someone who was rich using his wealth for generosity.

Luke 19: 1-8

And Jesus entered and passed through Jericho. And, behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus, which was the chief among the publicans, and he was rich.

And he sought to see Jesus who he was; and could not for the press, because he was little of stature. And he ran before, and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him: for he was to pass that way.

And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up, and saw him, and said unto him, Zacchaeus, make haste, and come down; for to day I must abide at thy house. And he made haste, and came down, and received him joyfully.

And when they saw it, they all murmured, saying, That he was gone to be guest with a man that is a sinner.

And Zacchaeus stood, and said unto the Lord; Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have taken any thing from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold.

In the above passage we see how this rich guy conducted his business. He wasn't a believer at this stage – but perhaps even unknown to him he was applying Biblical principles and that is why he was successful.



The half of his goods he gives to the poor and if he was accused of any wrongdoing he restored fourfold.
